REASONS BEHIND THE FAILURE OF THE ATTEMPT TAKEN BY INDIA TO BAN PORNOGRAPHY

In India, authorities are opposed to making mature content available only online to the country's residents. Because of this, individuals are unable to carry out their desires to the fullest extent possible. A court judgment mandating Internet service providers (ISPs) in India to cease publishing pornographic content was issued on October 27. The request was made public on October 27. Twice, the government of India has made an effort to criticize China for its high level of pornographic consumption. Despite a Supreme Court order in August 2015, the government attempted to prohibit access to 857 websites containing sexually explicit content. It was a pornographic film that a woman who had been sexually assaulted in Dehradun, Uttarakhand, recreated for the state's Supreme Court this time. Dehradun is the capital of Uttarakhand. In order to keep Indians from accessing obscene material on the internet, the

court will have a tough time. This is correct, regardless of the court's objectives. When the Indian government notified Internet service providers of their decision, the most popular pornographic website, Pornhub, promptly constructed a mirror site with a slightly different web address or URL that is solely for Indian visitors. No Indian legislation prohibits people from secretly viewing pornography or other forms of adult content, hence the problem of widespread and extremely serious usage of the internet cannot be addressed by the Indian government. Corey Price, vice president of Pornhub, reportedly said as much in a statement: "For grownups like us as a scapegoat." If Indians decided to outlaw websites like our parents for hosting adult content, the government would suffer. grows to be one of the leading experts in the field of parental control and unpleasant concluding pages. In the interim, social media has been a buzz with discussion of the ban.

LAW SIN REGULATING PORNOGRAPHY IN INDIA:

In every country, the laws about pornography have a lot to do with what people think and how society works. Even though it is considered rude to talk about sexual encounters in India, a large number of people there are interested in pornographic media. Even though there is no specific law on the subject, there are a number of rules that deal with the problem of pornography and the different ways it can be done. Some of these laws are the Indian Penal Code, which was made in 1860, the POCSO Act, which was made in 2012, the Indecent Representation of Women Act, which was made in 1986, and the Information Technology Act, which was made in 2000. As a start, Section 67 of the Information Technology Act of 2000 says that the following things can get you up to three years in prison and a fine of up to five lakh rupees.

Publication- which would include uploading on a website, WhatsApp group or any other digital where third parties can have access to such content.

Transmission-

Anyone can be in this group if they send pornographic photos or photos by email, text message, WhatsApp, or any other digital platform. This is a pretty broad set of words that could lead to the intermediary gateway being held responsible for the offensive content that the offender posted or sent through it. This type of phrase includes everything that is published or sent out. The Intermediary Guidelines, which are part of the Information Technology Act, say that it is the responsibility of the intermediary or service provider to do enough due diligence to make sure that their site is not being used in a bad way.

Section 67B of the Information Technology Act says that child pornography is illegal. If you publish, send, or cause to be sent or published in electronic form any material with sexually explicit acts or conduct, you could go to jail for up to five years and have to pay a fine of up to ten lakh rupees. Section 67A of the Information Technology Act says that anything that shows sexually explicit acts or behavior cannot be published, sent, or made to be sent or published electronically.

Second, IPC rule 292 says that you can't sell pornographic materials. Section 292(1) and Section 292 talk about what it means to be "obscene" and what happens if you sell, give away, or otherwise make obscene things available (Section 292(1) says that a piece of content is offensive if it is lascivious or pornographic, or if any part of it could corrupt or deprave the public. Section 292 of the Code says that a person is guilty if they: This person can sell, give away, rent, show, or do anything else with anything that is offensive. Brings offensive material from another country into the country with the knowledge that it will be bought, sold, or spread there. If he is involved in or gets money from a business where he has reason to believe that such offensive things are being used for the reasons listed above, or if he gets money from such a business.

If a person is found guilty of a crime for the first time, they could get a simple or strict sentence of up to two years in prison and a fine of up to 2,000 yen. A person who has been convicted of a crime twice could get a fine of up to 5,000 yen and a simple or hard prison sentence of up to 5 years.

Section 293 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860, spells out the punishments that should be given to anyone who sells, rents, or gives any obscene item to a person under the age of 20. For a first conviction, a person can spend up to 3 years in prison and pay a fine of up to \$5,000. For a second conviction, they can spend up to 7 years in prison and pay a fine of up to \$5,000. It also says that a person can be fined up to \$5,000 if they are found guilty again. About the POCSO Act of 2012, which was made a law to keep children from being exposed to sexual assaults. Children are safe from sexual abuse, sexual harassment, and pornographic media because of this law. The goal of the law is to protect the interests

and well-being of local children. Under the law, a "child" is anyone under the age of 18. The Act makes it illegal to treat people differently based on their gender.

Here is a breakdown of the parts of the POCSO Act that deal with cyber pornography:

Section 13 of the POCSO Act of 2012 says that child pornography is any form of media that uses a child for sexual entertainment. This is what is meant by the term "child pornography." This word can be used for all kinds of media.

Section 14 of the POCSO Act, which was passed in 2012, says what the punishment is for using children in pornographic productions.

Last but not least, the Indecent Representation of Women's Act of 1986 tries to make it illegal to show women or any part of their bodies in a way that is offensive or bad for public morals. The Act was made so that women wouldn't have to worry about their bodies being shown in a bad way. Under Section 79 of the IT Act, intermediaries and Internet service providers are protected by a "safe harbor" that lets them stay out of trouble for this kind of content that shows up on their platforms. Because of this protection, they won't have to deal with this kind of content. Even though these kinds of content are still available for free on platforms and even though the law on intermediaries requires them to make a foolproof due diligence system to avoid this kind of content, there hasn't been much progress in this area. By law, the intermediaries have to respond to requests for information from the government or the court, but they often don't do this. This is because it is hard to meet this responsibility because of the strict respect for a person's right to privacy, which is made possible by encryption methods that can't be broken. This kind of exception isn't allowed if the intermediaries are to blame for the offense or don't act quickly enough on requests to delete content. According to the standards, companies must make it clear to customers what content they can upload, use, share, or publish on these platforms. This rule is something they have to follow.

In 2018, the International Center for Missing and Exploited Children put out a model law about child pornography and media that shows sexual abuse of children (ICMEC). The goal of this law was to keep kids from seeing things that they shouldn't see. The model law and Indian law are very similar when it comes to making sure that children are not used sexually. The POCSO Act and the IT Act both have different ideas of what child pornography is. The POCSO Act makes it illegal to own child porn, but the IT Act goes much further and makes it illegal to even surf child porn. The POCSO Act and the IT Act, on the other hand, have some different rules. In rare cases, the content being found by accident could also be seen as a breach of contract. The model law says that service providers and intermediaries must give mandatory reports. However, this requirement is not in the most basic form of Indian law. Indian law makes it just as hard and time-consuming to get information.

Retribution porn is a fairly new trend that is defined as "sexually explicit pictures of a person posted online without that person's permission, usually as a form of revenge or harassment." A case about retaliation porn was heard in West Bengal's Sessions Court, and the offender was found guilty of breaking Sections 66E, 66C, 67, and 67A of the Information Technology Act as well as Sections 354, 354A, 354C, and 509 of the Indian Penal Code. When these laws were put together, they were put into effect. The court found that she had been raped, and the state was told to give her money to make up for it.

In India, there have been a number of public interest litigations (PILs) filed about pornography in an effort to come to a clear decision. The government has been told how to set up procedures, but outlawing everything would not have been a good or practical solution. On the other hand, after the Uttarakhand High Court said that pornographic websites were illegal, the government started asking internet service providers to block 827 sites in 2018. Network operators like Bharti Airtel, Reliance Jio, and Vodafone made it illegal to share this kind of content on their own networks.

Here is a brief overview of India's main pornographic law:

- It is not against the law to download or look at pornographic content online.
- It is against the law to share pornographic content.
- Owning pornographic material is not a crime in and of itself, unless the material is about children.
- There are rules about how and when the same can be sent electronically.

JUDICIAL DETERMINATION

A social worker who has filed petitions to limit access to pornographic websites is attempting to thwart judicial efforts to address the societal harm caused by pornography. The Supreme Court of India received a petition demanding for the criminalization of pornography in India in 2013. The court sent a notice to that location requesting a response from the national government of India. The government informed the court that information regarding the availability of obscenity on the internet was provided to the cyber regulatory advisory committee, which was established pursuant to Section 88 of the Information Technology Act of 2000, and that the judge had taken note of the format

ion. Vijay Panjwani, an attorney, petitioned the Supreme Court for an anti-pornography law. Although the court has not yet made a verdict, it has communicated with Panjwani over the petition. The statement was submitted to the House Committees on Information

Technology, Broadcasting, and Telecommunications, in addition to the Association of Internet Service Providers in India.

Kamlesh Vaswani also presented a new publication before the Supreme Court for the general public's benefit. Pornography has contributed to the surge in sexual assault on women, according to this report. A restriction on viewing pornographic content online is not desirable nor feasible, and it is surely not a basis for judicial action. The PIL seeks the blocking of a number of websites. According to an article by Utkarsh Anand, New Delhi, published on April 28th, pornography may not be completely prohibited online, and legal redress is not always available in this country. This was said by the highest court of the government. Furthermore, pornography is not entirely illegal in the country. According to the Department of Telecom (DoT), it is not viable to prohibit pornographic websites due to the practical constraints involved. Internet in a foreign country, which is often where the services utilized in this publication and approved for use are located. Although this assertion was questioned, the government asserted that information was filtered less thoroughly prior to its broadcast in cyberspace. The Supreme Court reached out to the Secretary of the Department of Transportation for additional information regarding this publication. In response to the secretary's inquiry, the Department of Transportation (DoT) indicated that its participation is limited. On the other hand, the procedure is regarded as a request.

Apar Gupta, executive director of the Internet Freedom Foundation, a New Delhi-based non-profit group, asserts that Indian Internet service providers can restrict mirror sites without the need for legislation. In addition, since the Supreme Court's order was only temporary and ceased to apply after the ban was lifted it is possible that they will not need to continue banning the initial 800 websites. The rationale behind the final prohibition on mirror sites remains unclear. As a result of 2010 amendments to the Information Technology Act, it is no longer permissible for the Indian government to demand that Internet service providers restrict access to a specific website containing inflammatory material.

According to Apar Gupta, Internet service providers can restrict access to adult pornographic websites to forestall future legal action that could compromise their ability to function legally. This may be the reason why new blocks are generated at random. Quartz reports that clients of Vodafone and ACT Fibernet can access the Pornhub mirror site, however Bharti Airtel and Reliance Jio customers cannot. On the other hand, ACT FiberNet clients are unable to access svideos2.com, a mirror site of the notorious pornographic website XVideos.

ONE MAY NOT GET AROUSAL WITH ONE'S SPOUSE
